

## **CLUB SAFETY OFFICER ROLE**

The Club Safety Officer needs to adopt a proactive approach to safety. Dragon Boating is a safe and enjoyable sport; however, it has inherent risks which the Club Safety Officer has a responsibility to mitigate by promoting safe practices across their club membership.

## **Duties:**

Specific duties include, but are not limited to:

- Establishing and maintaining effective relationships with the DBACT Safety Officer and other Club Safety Officers.
- 2. Be conversant with all AUSDBF and DBACT safety related documents, in particular the AUSDBF Safety Manual and DBACT annexures to that Safety Manual.
- Encourage club members to be compliant with AUSDBF and DBACT safety related documents.
- 4. Submit incident or injury reports to DBACT via Safe365.
- 5. Ensuring club members know what constitutes an incident or injury.
- 6. Ensuring club members wear enclosed shoes and appropriate clothing.
- 7. Ensuring club members wear PFDs when needed and/or required.
- 8. Ensuring club members know how to correctly wear PFDs.
- 9. Ensuring club swim tests are conducted in a safe manner.
- Correct any unsafe acts that are noticed, or that the Club Safety Officer is made aware of.
- 11. Inform the DBACT Safety Officer of any unsafe acts that are noticed or that Club Safety Officers are made aware of.
- 12. Ensuring club safety bags contain all necessary contents.
- 13. Check safety bag contents for expiry date and replace items when needed.
- 14. Advise club members of any updates or changes to safety procedures.
- 15. Provide training opportunities to club members, for example, by promoting DBACT courses.
